

Things to Bring to DBS Tax, Inc.

 - Health Insurance Marketplace statement – Form 1095-A
 - All W2s, 1099s, and W2-Gs.
 - Interest and Dividends – 1099-INT and 1099-DIV
 - Retirement, Social Security, VA, and IRA income documents
 - Self-Employment, Subcontractor, and Rental Income documents
 - K-1s from Partnerships, Trusts, and S Corporations
 - Unemployment and Gambling income (including Gambling losses)
 - 1099-Bs Stock Sales and Mutual Fund Shares sold (Include both purchase date and amount paid)
- ✓ Self-Employment Documents (Including Gig Economy, eBusiness, and Online Selling, i.e., Uber, eBay, Airbnb, Etsy, etc.)

NOTE: Taxpayers are responsible for the accuracy of their tax return even if someone else prepares it for them. Because something gets past your preparer does not mean that you are off the hook. When you sign your tax return, you're signing "Under penalties of perjury, I declare I have examined this return and accompanying schedules and statements, and to the best of my knowledge and belief **THEY ARE TRUE, CORRECT, AND ACCURATELY LIST all AMOUNTS and SOURCES OF INCOME.**" Taxpayer(s) understand that DBS Tax, Inc prepares income taxes only. DBS Tax, Inc does not calculate interest or penalties assessed by IRS.



Cellular bills are often challenged by IRS Revenue Agents who vary in what deduction they will allow. Some Revenue Agents require the taxpayer prove that the “primary purpose” of the cell phone is for business purposes. IRS may not allow the cell phone expenses unless the business portion exceeds the amount that would have been paid were it not used for business. Taxpayers are often required to prove that they wouldn’t even need a cell phone were it not for business.

Employee vs. Independent Contractor. Where Employees are improperly classified by IRS or the State of Tennessee as Independent Contractors, taxpayer understands that penalties can be severe and hereby accepts responsibility for any misclassification. Generally, Independent Contractors dictate their own hours, have their own tools, software, and licensing. They have their own clients, phone book listings, and business cards that don’t name or reference you.

If business use of the home is deducted, taxpayer hereby confirms that the business area is used **EXCLUSIVELY** for business on a regular basis. The IRS has been known to come to homes unexpectedly to look at home office.

Your returns may be selected for audit, review, or additional inspection. While we stand behind our work and will take care of any mistakes made by DBS Tax, Inc, we prepare your tax return based on information you have provided. Errors in the information provided to us will result in additional charges to correct. DBS Tax, Inc. has also not billed for potential problems that may or may not arise from taxing authorities. Some IRS notices take hours to respond to. Some IRS notices take days or even weeks to respond to. Fees and expenses for defending future IRS claims have not been anticipated at this time and shall be invoiced by Separate Agreement if necessary.

IRS is doing their best to provide you with online access to your records. You can now communicate directly with IRS by signing up for their new Get Your Tax Record at <https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript> You’ll be able to access wage and income documentation, prior-year returns, and balance dues. You’ll need a cell phone and the knowledge to pass their vigorous multi-factor authentication.

Deposits and fees paid are considered earned upon receipt or upon leaving tax documents with DBS Tax, Inc. whichever comes first. Returns will not be filed until invoice is paid in full. Taxpayer hereby agrees to mediation to settle any disputes that may arise therefrom. Loser will pay the costs thereof.

Nonrefundable Deposits may be requested on tax returns as DBS Tax, Inc. determines. Price depends upon complexity, timeliness, and proper documentation, which may or may not be known until the tax return has been completed. Time availability during tax season is of utmost importance! If taxpayer fails to submit requested documentation (or payment) within 7 days of request, DBS Tax, Inc. is hereby granted option to cancel/nullify engagement whereby taxpayer will forfeit any unused deposit for failure thereof.

Recordkeeping Guidelines & Engagement Letter

I have reported all income from, including cash and barter transactions to DBS Tax, Inc. to prepare my 2021 personal income tax returns. Sales Tax, Occupational Tax, Room Tax, Employer Tax Returns, or other tax returns will require separate Fees and Engagement.

All of the W-2's, 1099's, K-1s, social security cards, etc. will be returned to me by the preparer. Everything I tell my tax preparer is confidential unless it's the IRS asking. I have not relied on any investment advice or referrals received from DBS Tax, Inc. without verification.

Receipts are required and recordkeeping is mandatory according to IRS regulations. Checks and bank statements are insufficient as receipts. Checks are proof of payment only when accompanied by a receipt. I understand that the IRS may require ***supporting documents such as bank deposit slips, receipt books, billing invoices, credit card slips, canceled (imaged or substitute) checks, proof of payments, and account statements***. I understand that records must be maintained contemporaneously that reflect time, place, and business purpose. To be deductible, an expense must be ordinary and necessary. Ordinary means that it is common and accepted in the business or other activity. Necessary means that it is appropriate for the business. The burden of proof, therefore, shall lie with the taxpayer. If any records are determined to be incorrect or any errors are found within the client's records, the client will be responsible for any IRS judgements.

I understand that disallowance of deductions or credits caused by inadequate or unsupported documentation ***SHALL NOT*** be the responsibility of DBS Tax, Inc.

If charity donations are deducted, taxpayer will maintain banking records along with receipts. To document deductions of personal items donated to bona-fide charities, taxpayer will maintain copies of:
1) Receipt from the charity, 2) Inventory of items donated, and 3) Photographs of items donated.
A bona-fide charity is one that maintains its 501 (c) (3) status and can be confirmed on IRS.gov.

I understand that I shall rely only on DBS Tax, Inc.'s written advice since unwritten advice may be tentative, incomplete, or not fully reviewed. Additional preparation fees are required for written advice.

I understand that if a question arises regarding the interpretation of tax law, my tax preparer will use professional judgment and experience in resolving the issues. I hereby agree to hold DBS Tax, Inc. harmless for interpreting conflicting tax issues in my favor.

After reviewing my tax return, DBS Tax Inc. has explained to me its merits, implications, comparisons, and how it was prepared. By signing the tax return, I am signing, under penalties of perjury, that it is true, correct, and complete. Ultimately, it is the taxpayer's responsibility to ensure the accuracy of the signed tax return.

The information furnished to DBS Tax, Inc. was relied upon without independent verification or audit. DBS Tax, Inc. ***SHALL NOT*** be held responsible for disallowed deductions and credits; or the inclusion of additional unreported income; including any taxes, penalties, or interest that may be assessed by IRS.

If gambling losses are deducted, taxpayer can prove such losses with casino win/loss statements, a gambling diary, or the Daily Players Card Record from the casinos. Current regulations allow that wins/losses may be netted each day which may reduce AGI and taxes.

If mileage is deducted, taxpayer has mileage log detailing business purpose, dates, and miles driven. IRS also requires odometer verification by a third-party vendor (smog check, professional car repairs).
